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### ☐ Steps:




1. Trace the child's hand, wrist and forearm on brown paper to make it look like a tree trunk.

## ☐ What you need:

- White paper
- Brown Paper
- •Red, Orange and Yellow Paint
- •Sponges (Any kinds)
- Scissors
- •Glue






2. Cut out the handprint and glue it onto the white paper.



3. Dip the sponges/fingers into the paint and use them to print leaves around the tree. Alternatively, use leaves dipped in paint to create leaf prints.
